Rachel Barenbaum will discuss her debut novel, A Bend in the Stars, and the themes that it addresses, including Antisemitism, Russia, emigration, love, and science. Set in 1914
Russia, the book tells the story of a Jewish scientist racing Einstein to prove relativity.
